

**2014 Domaine des Marvilhas
Laudun Maestral Blanc**

Tight and backwards at first, the 2014 Laudun Maestral Blanc has plenty of tart apple, pear and crushed rock-like nuances to go with a medium-bodied, elegant and racy style on the palate. Made from 95% Clairette and 5% Grenache Blanc that was brought up all in concrete tank, it will be better in six months and drink nicely for a year. It's a high quality white that will be versatile on the dinner table.

Domaine des Marvilhas was created in 2014 when Jean-Frédéric and Morgane Bistagne purchased vineyards from the Lirac-based Domaine Duseigneur estate. All of these latest releases have solid character and are well made.

**2013 Domaine des Marvilhas
Laudun Maestral Rouge**

A blend of 40% Grenache, 35% Cinsault and the rest Syrah, the ruby/purple translucent colored 2013 Laudun Maestral Rouge is medium-bodied and elegant with lots of violets, dried herbs, crushed rock and darker berry fruits. It has moderate depth and richness, yet shines for its purity and elegance.

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**2013 Domaine des Marvilhas
Lirac Pradau**

Deeper and richer than the Laudun Maestral cuvee, the 2013 Lirac Pradau is 40% Grenache, 40% Syrah and 20% Cinsault that spent 18 months in tank. It's a medium-bodied, lively and fresh effort that has lots of liquid blackberry, crushed rock, smoke and hints of violets on the nose. Pure, elegant and well made, with lively acidity, drink it over the coming 3-5 years.

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
